

At an Emergency meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Nunda, County of Livingston, State of New York, held at the Nunda Government Center located at 4 Massachusetts Street, Nunda, New York, on November 1, 2018 at 7:30 P.M. there were

A draft of proposed Introductory Local Law No. 2 of 2018 entitled "A Local Law to Override the Real Property Tax Cap Levy Established by General Municipal Law Section 3-c," was presented by the Town Supervisor. The proposed Introductory Local Law was prepared by the Town Attorney, David T. Pullen, at the request of the Town Supervisor. It was explained that this local law is necessary for the purpose of enabling the Town Board to adopt a budget for 2019 that exceeds the 2018 real property tax levy by more than 2.25%. Following discussion, the following resolution was introduced by James Forrester, who moved its adoption, and seconded by William Mann, to wit:

BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the Town Board of the Town of Nunda accepts and proposes to adopt a local law to be designated as Introductory Local Law No. 2 of 2018 entitled "A Local Law to Override the Real Property Tax Cap Levy Established by General Municipal Law Section 3-c," to authorize the Town Board to adopt a budget for 2019 providing for an increase in the town's tax levy that exceeds the 2018 tax levy by more than 2.25%, and that a copy of the proposed introductory local law is annexed hereto and incorporated into this resolution as though set out in full.
2. That a public hearing be held on November 13, 2018, at 7:00 P.M. at the Nunda Government Center located at 4 Massachusetts Street, Nunda, New York.
3. That the Town Clerk, with the assistance of the Town Attorney, is directed to prepare the legal notice required to be published and to provide such notice for timely publication in the official newspaper.
4. That a copy of such legal notice be posted upon the Town Clerk's bulletin board as required by law.

Following discussion, the foregoing resolution was called to a vote which resulted as follows:
